Thank you to everyone who has called or emailed content ideas and suggestions!

I am happy to report that robust visitor logons continue. The February visitor statistics are in, and the numbers are these: 7536 visitors during February were reported and SCAUWG.ORG hosted 9592 website sessions. The page impression rate was 1.83.

These monthly numbers are a bit less than January's. However, February only has 28 days, as opposed to January, and after doing the math, both February's daily average visitor rate (269.14) and the daily session rate (342.57) both exceeded January's stats! Even the page impression rate rose from 1.65 to 1.83.
